

# Strada Public Viewpoint: COVID-19 Work and Education Survey

Interview Dates: Oct. 14-29, 2020

Audience: National online survey of Americans ages 18 and above excluding retirees. Quotas based

on the U.S. Census were used to ensure results that are nationally representative by age,

gender, race/ethnicity, and region. Sample size n=1,593
